

# PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF AN AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT

## PERMIT NUMBER -PER9810

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

Licensed Pest Control Operators (PCOs) of NSW, ACT and QLD. Fully licensed Pest Control Operators and Officers of the Parks and Wildlife Commission of the Northern Territory in accordance with Commission Policy.

## **Restraints:**

DO NOT USE IN OR NEAR CROPS to ensure product does not come into contact with crops or feed for livestock.

## Jurisdiction:

NSW, ACT, QLD and NT only.

#### **Additional Conditions:**

- 1. Supply:
  - 1.1 A record must be kept of the identity of persons supplied with the product and the amount supplied. Note that only licensed PCOs are approved to use the product.

#### 2. Site Approval:

- 2.1 In NSW and ACT users covered by this permit are required to obtain a license from the National Parks and Wildlife Service before using the pesticide at any location. This licence must be obtained from NPWS prior to using the pesticide at each location. For further information contact Jeff Hardy (NPWS) on Ph: (02)9585 6481 or Fax: (02) 9585 6495.
- 2.2 In QLD users covered by this permit are not required to obtain a license from the Qld National Parks and Wildlife Service. However, users would need to ensure they exercise due care to avoid killing native wildlife. If wildlife were to be killed, the permit would not exempt the user from the possibility of being charged under State legislation (*Nature Conservation Regulation* Section 235).
- 2.3 In the Northern Territory, fully licensed Pest Control Operators are required to obtain written approval from the Northern Territory Parks and Wildlife Commission before using the pesticide at each location.

#### 3. Use:

- 3.1 Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the conditions of use of this permit.
- 3.2 This permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.
- 3.3 Do not allow access of the public to the bait or areas containing the bait.
- 3.5 Several free feeds are to be done before using baits treated with the product to establish whether native species are feeding and therefore at risk. If native species are at risk no treated bait is to be used until such time as a location can be found that precludes native species.
- 3.6 Bait stations must be used and must be of a design which will effectively retain the bait especially when used to control pigeons. The bait must be placed where risks to non-target species are minimal and spillage of treated bait will not occur due to wind or other environmental factors.

3.7 No poisoned bait shall be left at a location unattended unless there are no risks to non-target species.

## 4. Clean up:

- 4.1 Upon completion of the poisoning program no poisoned bait is to be left at the location. Licensed Pest Control Operators (PCOs) must remove any spilled bait or bait remaining in bait stations.
- 4.2 All dead and affected pigeons, other exotic birds and any non-target species must be removed from each location after each baiting. If required, affected birds must be humanely disposed of in a manner that does not create public concern.

## 5. **Disposal of Product:**

- 5.1 Destroy and dispose of used containers in the manner described on the label.
- 5.2 Do not contaminate ponds, waterways, streams, rivers or drains with the pesticide or used containers.
- 5.3 The persons to whom this permit is issued is responsible for the disposal of unused pesticide and/or unwanted containers in a manner which will not constitute harm, directly or indirectly to any person and/or the environment.

## 6. **Other Matters:**

- 6.1 The APVMA is to be immediately notified of any illness suffered by any person and/or any untoward or adverse effect on non-target species or on the environment, as a result of:
  - having the product in possession or custody; an/or
  - preparation for use and/or use of the product.
